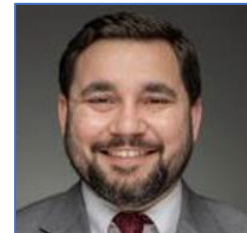

History Moment: On July 1, 2005, Ford produced the last of over 4.4 million Thunderbirds. Introduced in 1955 as a response to Chevrolet's Corvette, the first production run lasted until 1997. Ford reintroduced the Thunderbird as a two-seat luxury car in 2002 but ceased production again in 2005. By then, the T-Bird had been etched in American Culture: The Beach Boys sang about one, Suzanne Somers drove one in *American Graffiti*, and JFK had 50 of them in his Inaugural Parade.

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
